Minister confirms support for local initiatives to tackle congestion and praises TravelWatch

Transport Minister Rt Hon Rosie Winterton MP praised the work of TravelWatch East Midlands and similar voluntary bodies when she spoke at the conference "Charging or Choice" in Leicester on Tuesday.

Hosted by TravelWatch East Midlands, the independent body promoting passenger transport in the region, the conference examined the problem of road congestion and how it can be resolved. *"In particular, we were concerned that politicians, should not just pay lip service to the need for fast and efficient public transport, but take steps to make it a reality."* said TravelWatch East Midlands' chairman Alan Meredith of Rothley.

The Minister confirmed the Government's commitment to encourage and support financially, initiatives such as the "6cs project" – by the counties & and cities of Leicester, Nottingham & Derby, to find solutions to expected road congestion.

Survey reveals passenger's dissatisfaction with rail station

- **Station car parks are full, despite being overpriced**
- **Some bus services are poor and stops badly signposted with inadequate information**
- **Cycle storage is insecure and badly planned**
- **Access on foot is inconvenient and sometimes potentially dangerous.**

These are just some of the findings from the TravelWatch East Midlands survey of rail passengers at stations including Market Harborough, unveiled at the TravelWatch conference on Tuesday (16th).

Part of TravelWatch East Midlands' ongoing campaign to improve bus and rail services – the survey conducted in July, revealed dissatisfaction with the ease of access to many rail stations and may explain in part, why people

often prefer to use their car from door to door, rather than face a journey involving two or more methods of travel.

TravelWatch East Midlands' rail correspondent Steve Abbott said: "*Rail and bus operators need to operate in a joined up manner, providing good connections, with information and help when there are delays.*"
